#### Our Choices and Our Witness

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I often wonder why non-members requesting me to perform a wedding or funeral are excited to learn that I can accommodate them, “in the church” while members of my own congregation are just as likely to ask for a change of venue. I am not sure which scenario has caused me greater concern. As it turns out, the real irony has less to do with the request but more to do with what is unsaid.

Apparently, some unaffiliated people have a greater appreciation for what happens inside the walls of the church than those who are. They know that “inside” the church, the promises of God and the deepest desires of people come together. Who wouldn’t want some of that at the most important junctures of their lives?

I write this to anyone desiring their pastor, or any pastor, to perform a Holy Act on their behalf. Though the Bible does not speak to the issue of venue, (where two or three are gathered...is all it takes), it does speak to the choices of those who belong. If a non-affiliated person jumps at the chance to participate in what happens “inside the church,” what does this say about the choices of those who hear the Good News each week?

Most pastors are willing to serve the Lord outside the fold, but the goal is always to bring people in where people and God’s promises can come together each week.

# STEWARDSHIP

## In View of God's Mercy

The World Book Dictionary defines mercy as: "More kindness than justice requires; kindness beyond what can be claimed or expected." Mercy is one of the attributes of God. God is not obligated to show mercy, but He chooses to do so in keeping with His nature. God shows mercy because God is "*merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness*" (Exodus 34:6). Because God is merciful, we do not receive our due penalty for our sins. God gives us underserved blessing after blessing.

Through faith, we understand how blessed we are that God is merciful toward us. So how should we respond to God's mercies expressed in Christ? The Apostle Paul in his letter to the Romans told them, and He tells us the following: "*Therefore, I urge you, brothers, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God—which is your spiritual act of worship*" (Romans 12:1 NIV).

In response to God's mercy, we respond with praise and thanksgiving. In the Old Testament, one of the ways that God's people honored and thanked God for His mercy and blessings was through animal sacrifices. Animals were ceremonially killed and presented to the Lord. Jesus' death on the Cross became the sacrifice that eliminated the ongoing need for animal sacrifices. As New Testament Christians, Paul is now asking the Romans and us to "*offer [our] bodies as living sacrifices.*" Instead of bringing animals as substitutes for us, we offer ourselves. Through the Holy Spirit working in us, we are able and willing to respond to God's mercy by faithfully offering our lives and bodies through using our time, talent, and money in service to the Lord. Paul calls this our "*spiritual act of worship.*"

In the second verse in Romans 12, Paul is exhorting us, "*Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.*" Paul is telling us that "*in view of God's mercy*" we can and should stop following the ways of the world. With the help of the Holy Spirit, we are changed and transformed into new creations (2 Corinthians 5:17) who are enabled to say "no" to the ways of the world and live according to God's will.

### Are You Interested in Automatic Giving?



You can arrange to have your offerings made through a pre-authorized withdrawal from your bank account. You determine the frequency of your automatic donation – weekly, semi-monthly, or monthly – the option is yours. The church receives automatic giving donations on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> of the month. Your donation is deposited into the church's bank account on the same day it is withdrawn from your account. 
## CHURCH FUNDRAISER – SPARTAN NASH DIRECT YOUR DOLLARS PROGRAM



