STEWARDSHIP

We Are Stewards

Many individuals, groups, and organizations have defined stewardship in different meaningful ways over decades and generations. The following definition, out of possibly thousands, is focused on for this article because it captures the primary purpose of stewardship which is to use all that God entrusts to us for His purposes to care for both man and creation:

"A steward is more than a servant, slave, or trustee. A steward is one who, having received a trust from God, is in partnership with God through Christ for the working out of God's purposes for man and the world" (Joseph F. Jones).

To deepen our understanding of stewardship, we will expand on the meaning of a few key words in the above definition. God's Word tells us that one of the first responsibilities He gave Adam and Eve was to be His **stewards** (Genesis 1:26; 2:15). As stewards, they were to protect and take care of God's creation. Adam and Eve heard directly from God as to how they were to care for all that He had created out of nothing. As stewards today, we receive our direction from God's Word found in Scripture.

In this definition, the word <u>trust</u> is used to reference all the gifts and blessings that come from God's loving hands. The first stanza from the hymn "We Give Thee But Thine Own" helps us understand what is meant by trust. "We give thee but thine own, Whate'er the gift may be; For all we have is thine alone, A trust, O Lord, from Thee."

In Philippians 1:3-5, we find one of the three times that Scripture uses the word <u>partnership</u>. "I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now." God not only wants us to receive and believe His gospel, but He expects us to share the life-saving gospel with others.

In our stewardship definition, we are called to be about <u>God's purposes</u>. God's Word is very clear about His purpose. In Luke 19:10 we read, "For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost." The Apostle Paul wrote, "This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Savior, Who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth" (1 Timothy 2:3-4). God invites us to use our God-given time, talents, and money in ways that help others come to know and believe in Jesus.

God honors us with the privilege and responsibility to be His stewards. Through our faithful stewardship, God receives the honor and glory that He deserves.



- ⇒ If you already are quite familiar with your Bible, this class will give you a renewed desire for deeper study.




Why Take Part in Bible Study?

What Christian "Witnessing" Could Do

One day a Christian approached Gary and said, "This is for you, a brand-new copy of God's Word." After a few comments on what that Word of God had done in his life, he gave it to Gary as a "gift". Gary did not read it immediately but placed it in the top drawer of the desk in his bedroom.

Sometime later when he was feeling down and out, he remembered that copy of God's Word that he received. He retrieved it from the desk and began to read it. "I needed something to help me with all the guilt and shame that was weighing so heavy upon me for past drug and alcohol use. Because of that person who thought enough to give me a copy of God's Word some years ago, I ultimately had somewhere to turn during a very dark time in my wayward life," said Gary. That evening, he wound up on his knees beside his bed and asked Jesus Christ to be Lord of His life.

After he made this decision, the very first thing he wanted to do was start going to church. The following Sunday morning, he got up and went to church. He arrived at church between Sunday school and the morning worship service, when people were milling around outside. Gary went in and sat down, and no one said anything to him. No one even acknowledged he was in the church.

Gary was getting ready to leave because he felt out of place, and no one wanted him there. While getting ready to go back to his car, a man came over and put his arm around Gary's shoulder. He told Gary, "Son, you're going to love our church. I'm so glad you came today. Come on in."

Instead of leaving discouraged, Gary stayed and remained seated in a back pew. Still, no one sat to his right or left. No one even greeted him during the welcome portion of the service. Gary was looking around for the man who'd so kindly welcomed him earlier. When it was time for the message, that man walked up to preach. This pastor became Gary's best friend. Gary has never forgotten how that pastor made him feel and the Scripture that he pulled out late one evening from his bedroom dresser drawer.

God would use Gary in the coming days and years for His glory. He received degrees in Pastoral Theology from Florida Baptist College in Lakeland and Hyles-Anderson College in Crown Point, Indiana. After 25 years of bi-vocational pastoring, he left the banking industry to become a full-time pastor. He currently pastors Seminole Baptist Church in Tallahassee, Florida, and leads his congregation to "continue to grow deeper so that it can continue to reach farther." Pastor Gary is married to his wife, Sharon, and they have three daughters and four grandchildren.

What is F.I.S.H. Friends Instantly Sharing Help

F.I.S.H. is a group of people from the Christian churches in Oscoda sharing, out of love, our concern and help for our neighbors in need. It is named after the ancient fish symbol used by the Christians to identify themselves during the time the Roman government was persecuting the Christians.

What is the F.I.S.H. Hotline?

The F.I.S.H. hotline is a dedicated local phone number (989) 254-9187 answered Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. by a <u>trained</u> volunteer. The volunteer will listen, ask questions of the caller and arrange for help and/or refer to other local organizations expert in meeting certain needs. Callers ask for help with food, shelter, clothing, transportation, utility bills, etc.

What Can Trinity Members Do?

- 1. Volunteer to be trained for the Hotline one or two days a month.
- 2. Fill Trinity's F.I.S.H. box with canned food, dried food, and boxed food products be sure to check expiration dates outdated food is NOT accepted.
- 3. VOLUNTEER at Trinity to check our F.I.S.H. box check "use by dates," box or bag the items, and take them to Sacred Heart F.I.S.H. food pantry.





