May we all keep Christ as the heart of our Christmas and see Jesus as the reason for our joy. God's blessings on your Christmas worship and celebration with loved ones.






### December Mission of the Month God's Children Haiti (Formerly Bon Samaritan)

Each subscription includes the *Michigan In Touch* supplement which is automatically inserted into each issue of those who have subscriptions through the District Office renewal process.

The new subscription year doesn't begin until March 2024, but **orders need to be submitted to the church office by December 10**<sup>th</sup> to take advantage of a discounted District rate of \$19.00/year. (Individual subscriptions ordered directly from CPH are \$24.99/year).

Payment for subscriptions should be made directly to Trinity Lutheran Church. Late orders will be charged an additional \$2.




