Financial Advice with Purpose

The phrase "Financial Advice with Purpose" is a short, thoughtful slogan used by Thrivent Financial Services. What is so intriguing about this catch phrase is the word "purpose." We are not aware as to how Thrivent defines purpose, but, in God's Word, we discover different purposes for our money.

The first important purpose for our money is to provide for our needs and for those of our families. Money is needed for food, shelter, transportation, and clothing. In the words of the Apostle Paul, "But if anyone does not provide for his relatives, and especially for members of his household, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever" (1 Timothy 5:8). We are to make every attempt to provide for our needs so we won't be a burden to others. We express God's love by caring and providing for our families.

A second important purpose for our money is to help those in need. In the Gospel of Matthew we read, "For you always have the poor with you..." (Matthew 26:11). When Paul started his ministry of sharing the Gospel, he was "asked...to remember the poor, the very thing I was eager to do" (Galatians 2:10). With joy, we should have that same attitude. God wants to use us as His channels through whom He works to support those in need. Our help goes beyond the poor to the handicapped, the sick, the widows, the orphans, etc.

Another important purpose for our money is to extend God's kingdom. God gives us the privilege and responsibility to be participants in His mission "to seek and to save the lost" (Luke 19:10). Our heavenly Father does not want anyone to "perish, but that all should reach repentance" (2 Peter 3:9). God wants us to be active, involved, and willing participants in His plan of salvation for all people. As participants with the Lord, we become His hands, feet, and mouth. To share the Gospel with all people costs money and that money comes from us. God works though us to fund the mission and ministries that share Jesus' love.

In order to fulfill our purposes to have the funds for our needs, to help those in need, and to spread the Gospel, we need to be money wise. We are unable to be generous if we are drowning in debt and living paycheck to paycheck. By God's grace, we can live within our means, spend wisely, avoid debt, save diligently, insure adequately, and give freely. One of our money goals should be to live wisely to share generously. With God's help, we will hear Him say, "Well done, good and faithful servant" (Matthew 25:21).

MISSION GRANT HIGHLIGHT

FAMILY OF GOD LUTHERAN CHURCH, CLARK PARK STREET MINISTRY - \$5,000

Family of God Lutheran is a non-profit ministry committed to bringing the gospel to the lives of residents living in southwest Detroit. They have been serving the homeless and addicted there since 1996. They formed a street ministry at Clark Park during the 2020 pandemic when they were unable to meet in church. At Clark Park they provided a lunch bag meal, prayer, and a worship service. Family of God has continued this ministry, and this grant will help purchase a trailer for them to store essentials for basic hygiene needs, a tent for their services and a propane heater for the winter months.





The **Monroe Zone** Prayer Day service was held at "Wellspring Lutheran Services" in their chapel.

In the Zone

The **Macomb South Zone** Fall Frolic was held under the theme "Sharing Our Blessings." The women from the zone

gathered personal items and assembled 117 Blessing Bags which were taken to MCREST (Macomb County Rotating Emergency Shelter Team) in Mt. Clemens.



MCREST provides temporary shelter, transportation, meals

and training for homeless women and children in Macomb County.

The LWML Daughters In Mission group held its annual Epiphany Brunch at St. Luke, **Ann Arbor Area Zone**. Our guest worship and dramatic leader was Wendysue Fluegge, who presented "Reflections of Mary."



In February Trinity, Utica in the **Evergreen Zone** hosted a Valentine Tea for 100 ladies in attendance. Guest speaker Dolly Ireland spoke of how to be Strong in the Lord based on Bible passages. A history of the mite box was given. Over \$200 was collected for mites.
